Compromiso con el cuidado y la ética del cuidado (Committed to care and the ethics of care)

This monograph offers information on how to apply the ethics of care in different settings in the social services and healthcare sectors, which can help contribute to the well-being and quality of life for people. It includes a notable contribution from Marian Barnes, who examines the importance of the ethics of care in the fight for social justice. It also includes contributions from Victòria Camps, Carme Casas, Victor Montori and Pilar Delgado.



Cuidarse en la sociedad entre pandemias (Care in the pandemic society)

How have public health policies affected the notion of care? Philosophers, health workers and other healthcare professionals examine the preventive recommendations that limited physical contact between people during the pandemic. This book focuses on the consequences of isolation, quarantine and the experiences encountered within nursing homes.



Soledad no deseada en la era digital (Involuntary solitude in the digital era)

Today there is a growing number of initiatives that offer support for the elderly living alone, including tools that make use of AI-based algorithms, social robotics, or applications for use in healthcare and social work. This book explores their use in alleviating unwanted solitude, considering them from technological, philosophical, social, anthropological and administrative perspectives.

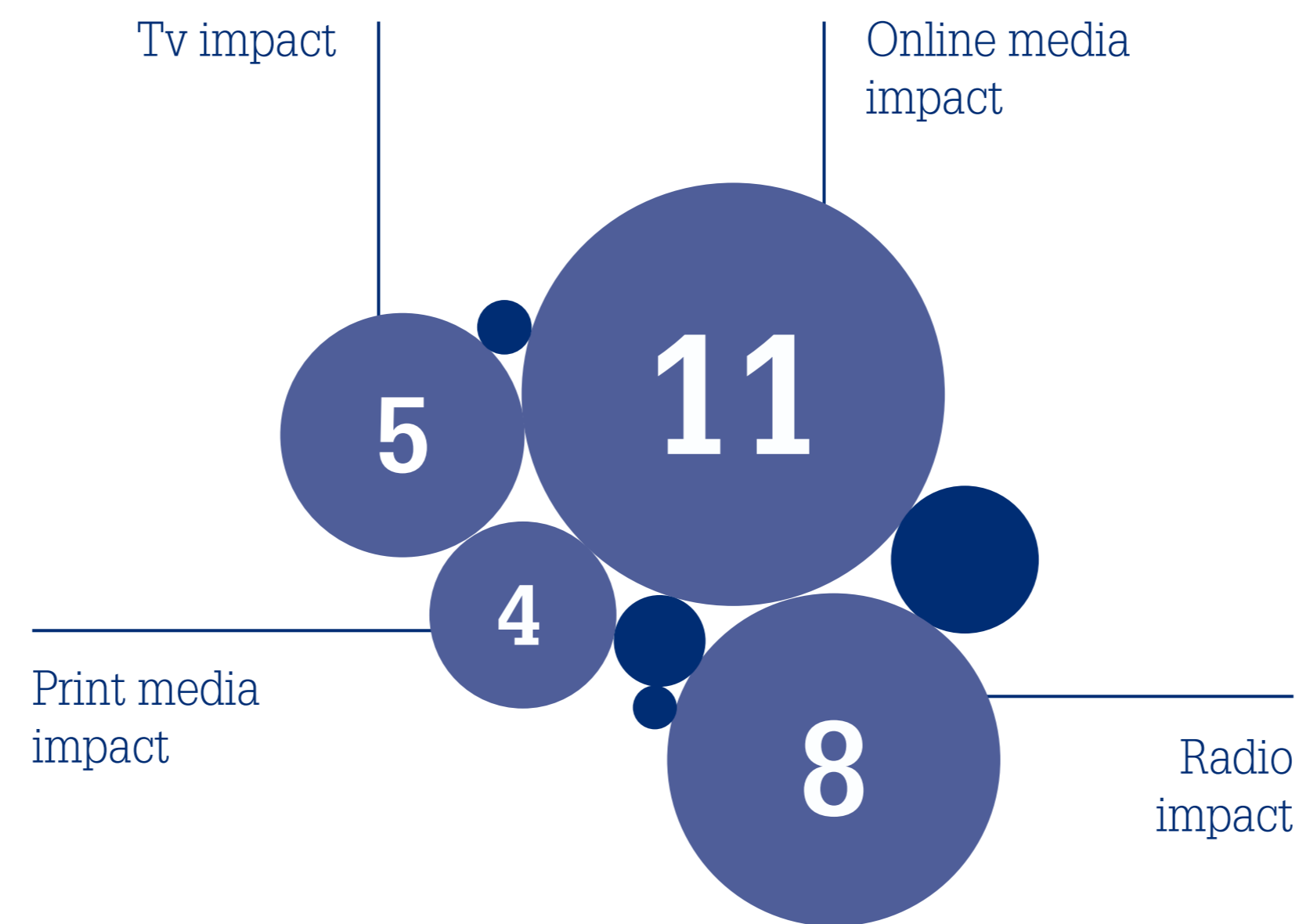

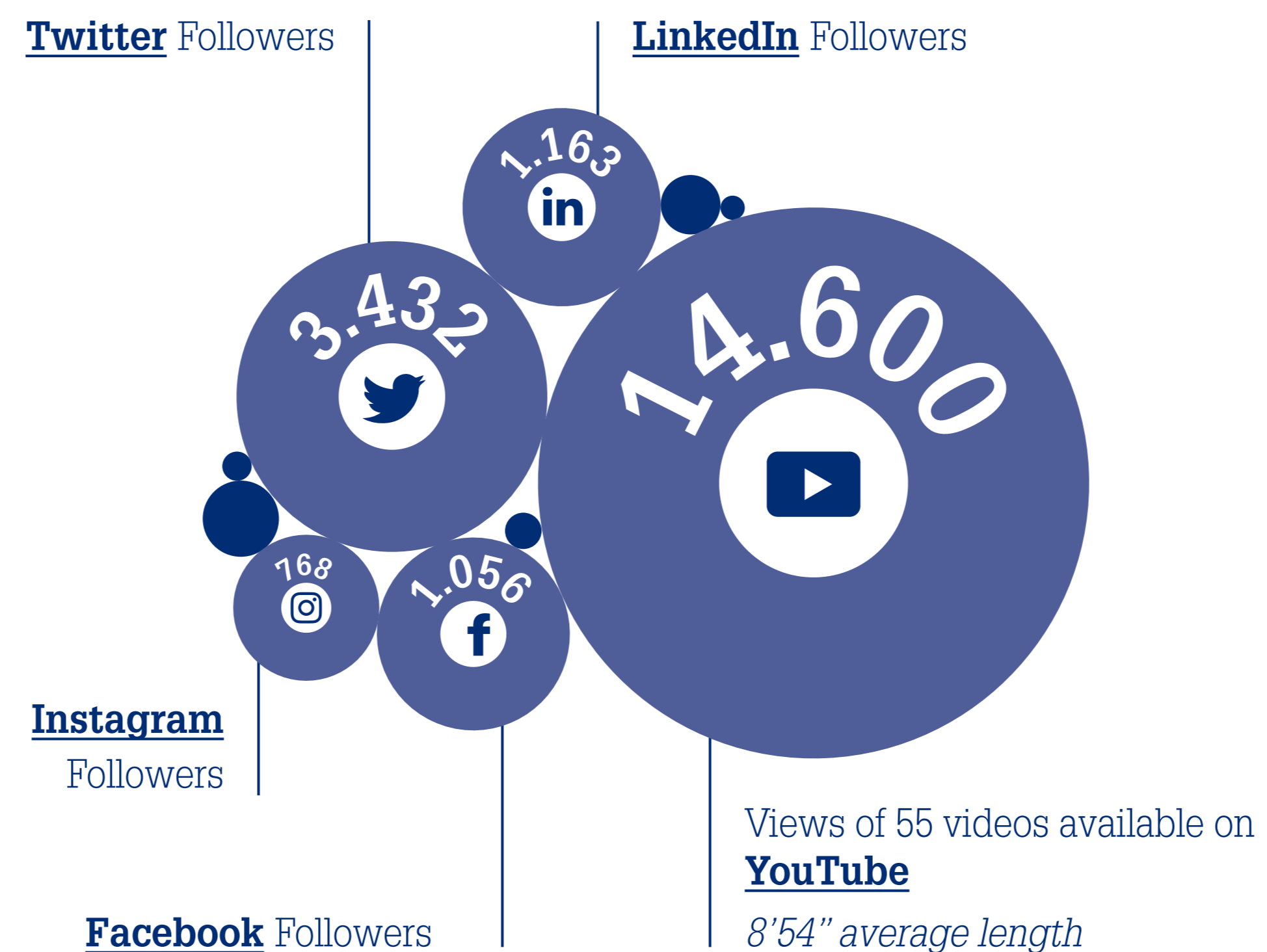

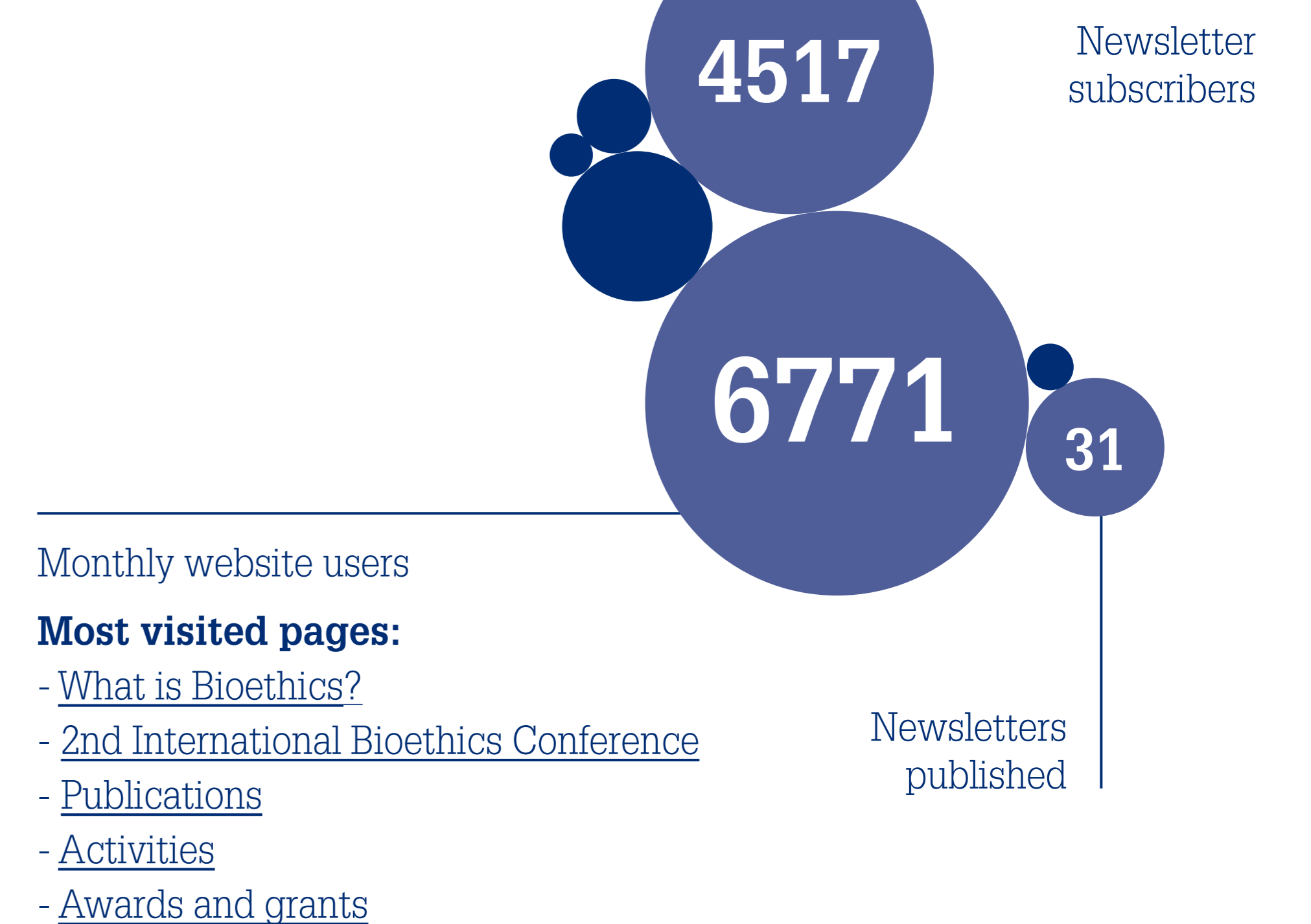

MÁS EUTANASIA Y MENOS SUICIDIO ASISTIDO

Nuevo de cada 10 personas que solicitan ayuda para morir en nuestro país preferen que los equipos sanitarios les administren la sustancia letal a ingerirla ellas mismas

RAFAEL J. AGUADO, JURISTA. La sala se oscureció un poco y en la pantalla apareció Fatima García Castrejón. No podía mover más que el cuello y hablaba con una dicción tan ajena a la que la definió toda la vida que el video necesitó subtítulos.

«Me voy de mi cuerpo, que no me deja ser lo que soy. Mi cuerpo ahora es una cárcel y yo no he hecho nada malo para estar en una cárcel. Y eso lo tiene que entender todo el mundo».

Los juristas y sanitarios que estaban allí reunidos para hablar de eutanasia tropezaron salta. Era un silencio de permiso, un íntimo consentimiento de derecho. Ahí estaba, como en un testamento animado, el final de la historia de Fatima, 50 años de edad, psicopodagoga y víctima de una diabetes degenerativa irreversible que le impedía ya cualquier movimiento autónomo.

Fue el primer caso de eutanasia legal acometido en Castilla-La Mancha y un equipo de la televisión autonómica había grabado el testimonio para emitirlo un día después de que Fatima muriera.

Ella recibió la eutanasia el 11 de enero, el video se emitió el día 12 y un auditorio de abogados, jueces, médicos y técnicos lo vio a finales del pasado septiembre en una sala tenue y sobrecogida del XXI Congreso Derecho y Salud, organizado en Logroño por la asociación Justas de la Salud.

Se trataba de reparar 15 meses de eutanasia en España... Y la conclusión es que el proceso está garantizando en mayor medida la voluntad de la persona que la acción eutanásica se practique en presencia y vigilancia de un equipo médico, los pacientes prefieren que sea el sanitario el que les administre por vía intravenosa la sustancia que acabará con sus vidas a ingerirla oralmente ellas mismas.

«Por qué?»
«Porque se sienten más arropados con sus médicos o enfermeros. Aunque en el suicidio asistido el equipo sanitario también tiene que estar presente, en la práctica, a los pacientes les da un poco de reparo administrarse ellos mismos la medicación. Además, si viene de manos de un profesional, les resta incertidumbre». Es Mónica Terribas, vocal de la Comisión de Evaluación y Garantías de la Eutanasia de Castilla-La Mancha, la comunidad que más peticiones ha recibido y más eutanasias ha practicado durante el primer año de vigencia de la ley.

La incertidumbre es un demonio con tanto poder que altera la vida... y la muerte. Para alguien que ha tomado la decisión de ser ayudado a morir, no estar absolutamente seguro de que la última sustancia sea la última debe ser una tortura.

«Aunque el compuesto que ingiere el paciente en suicidio asistido está preparado y validado por los equipos farmacéuticos y médicos, puede haber una sensación subjetiva de incertidumbre», sostiene Terribas, también vicepresidente del Comité de Bioética de Castilla-La Mancha y directora de la Fundación Víctor Grifols i Lucas, dedicada a la ética en la salud humana.

Ahí que frente a la incertidumbre, certeza.

Y unida a ella, confianza, otra de las grandes razones. «La gente se fía de sus médicos. Ellos han aceptado la petición de la persona, les han acompañado en todo el proceso y les ofrecen mucha confianza. No sólo es confianza personal, sino confianza en el sistema sanitario. Por eso los pacientes confían en los sanitarios a la hora de recibir la sustancia». Habla María Martín Aguilera, jefa del Servicio de Coordinación Socioasistencial de Castilla-La Mancha.

El tercer argumento es la rapidez. Lo sabe bien el psicólogo Javier Velasco, presidente de la asociación Derecho a Morir Dignamente, que lleva décadas estudiando las figuras de la eutanasia y el suicidio asistido en los países donde hace mucho tiempo que están legalizadas. «La eutanasia es un método más rápido que el suicidio asistido. La solución química entra por vía intravenosa y actúa antes que con un método oral en el que el paciente tiene que ingerir una sustancia. En esos casos hay posibilidades de vomito, con lo que el paciente no fallaría y habría que volver a ingerir el compuesto. Siendo ambas modalidades tranquilas y eficaces, los propios sanitarios prefieren claramente la de la eutanasia».

Mónica Terribas ofrece un dato: «De las 80 personas que obtuvieron ayuda para morir durante el primer año de vigencia de la ley en Cataluña, 58 optaron por la eutanasia y 2 por el suicidio asistido. O sea, 97% frente a 3%».

«A los pacientes les da reparo ingerir la sustancia. Se sienten más arropados por el equipo médico»

Médicos y juristas radiografan los primeros 15 meses de vigencia del derecho a la muerte digna

Piden acortar el tiempo de reflexión en casos de terminales y alargarlo para enfermos mentales

Eutanasia... un derecho que han ejercido mayoritariamente en España personas con enfermedades neurológicas (procesos degenerativos, parálisis o demencias) seguidas de enfermos oncológicos con mal pronóstico y pacientes con multimorbilidades.

Todo estaba dentro de los dos supuestos de la ley: tener una enfermedad grave e incurable que origina sufrimientos físicos o psíquicos constantes e insuportables sin posibilidad de alivio que la persona considere tolerable, con un pronóstico de vida limitado y en un contexto de fragilidad progresiva.

O...
Sufrir un padecimiento grave, crónico e insuportable, hecho que hace referencia a limitaciones sobre la autonomía física de manera que no permite valerse por sí mismo, así como sobre la capacidad de expresión y relación, y que llevan asociado un sufrimiento físico o psíquico constante e intolerable, soportando seguridad o gran probabilidad de que tales limitaciones vayan a persistir en el tiempo sin posibilidad de curación o mejoría apreciable.

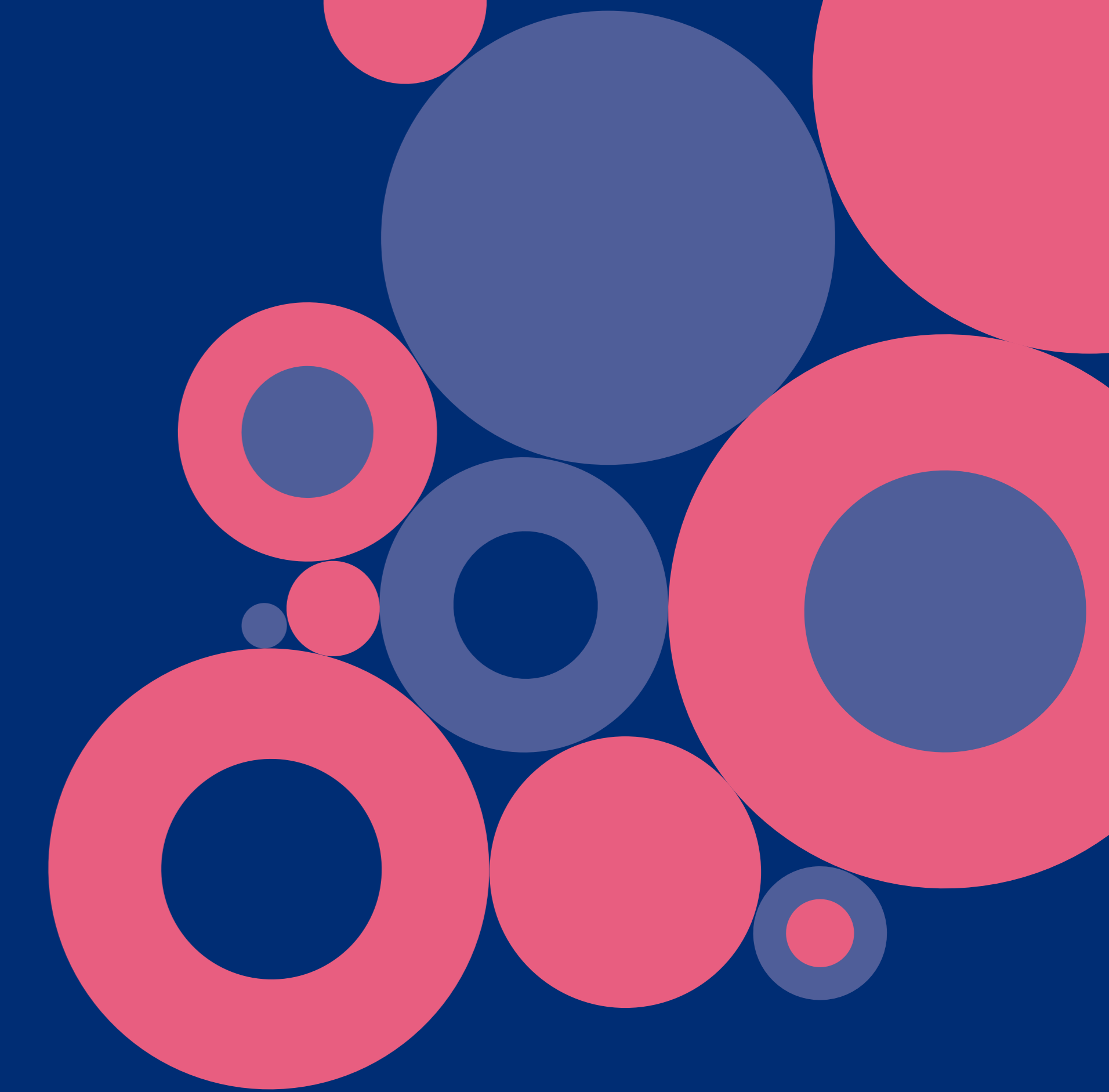
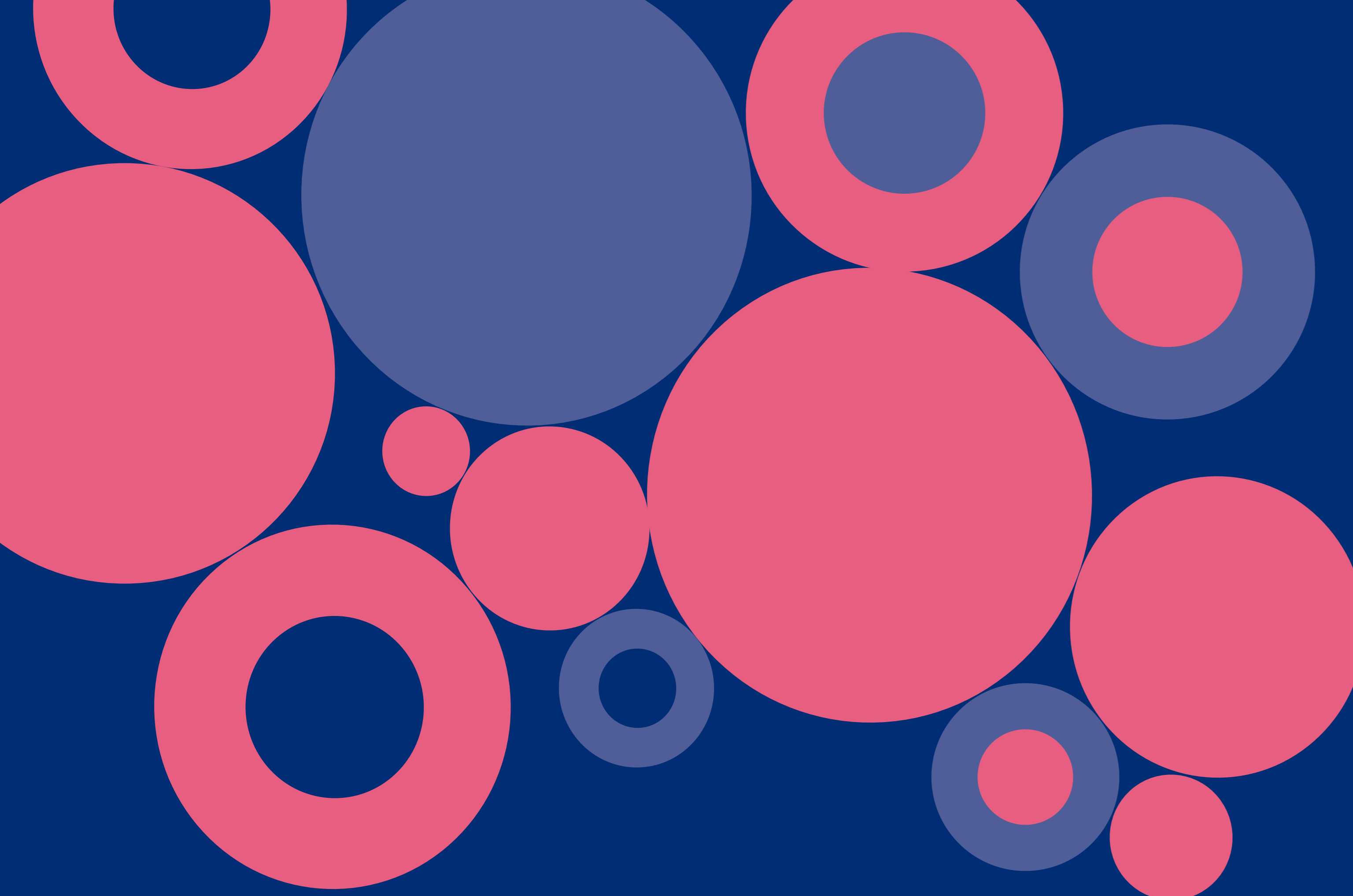
